The event or project undertaken by this candidate will be a beacon of hope for many others struggling in the conservation sector and provide inspiration to other conservationists and supporters of conservation

The successful delegate will have shown a great capacity for achieving conservation goals , in the conservation and preservation of cultural and natural assets.

A shortlist will be decided upon by a panel, and the final 3 finalists will be presented to Dr Goodall to select the most outstanding nominee

- 2. Outline the event, and/or task, that has lead you to nominate them for the Hope and Inspiration award(less than 500 words)**
- 3. Why has this provided hope and inspiration for the conservation community and broader community(less than 250 words)**
- 4. Has the candidate been recognised previously for their efforts?(less than 250 words)**
- 5. How would you describe the character of the nominee, and their attitude towards working as a ranger or protected area worker**

All applications are encouraged to attach links and files (under 200KB) to support the criteria

Applications for this award close on August 20 2014

The successful candidate will be notified by August 31st 2014 World Ranger Day and Dr Jane Goodall will announce the winner online.

The winning nomination will receive funds to meet the reasonable travel and accommodation costs for the award recipient to attend the IUCN World Parks Congress 2014 to receive their award at a dedicated ceremony.

The decision of the selection committee is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
