


## Why in Argentina?

- ✓ Safe country.
- ✓ Cheap economy.
- ✓ No serious health threats.
- ✓ Very biodiverse.
- ✓ It has over 1000 rangers.
- ✓ It has nearly 580 protected areas.
- ✓ It protects 46 million ha. (16,6%) of its land.
- ✓ It has a history of protected areas of over a hundred years.
- Many indigenous communities are bonded to protected areas and work in unison with the National Park Administration.










## Misiones

- ✓ Medium T° in October: 22,1°C
- ✓ Rainfall in October: 225mm
- ✓ Surface: 3 million ha.
- ✓ Protected areas: 1,4 million ha aprox. (46%)
- Misiones province has a serious network of protected areas (63) and many provincial rangers.
- ✓ It has a Ranger school.
- ✓ It has also a cultural World Heritage Site: the Jesuitical Missions.
- ✓ It has a Biosphere Reserve (Yabotí).
- ✓ It is over the Guaraní Aquifer



# Union of National Park Rangers of the Argentine Republic (SIGUNARA)



DE LA REPÚBLICA ARGENTINA

- > Union that groups half the national rangers of Argentina.
- Founded in the late 80 ´.
- Has been regularized recently.
- It 's working actively in ranger's agreements and rules.
- It 's willing to work and develop the World Ranger Congress 2027.
- It will ask the National Park ´s Administration to allow some rangers to organize the event in 2027.
- > Member of the Latin American Federation of Park Rangers

## Administración de Parques Nacionales (APN)



- In 1903 starts the history of Argentina ´s National Park with the donation of 7500 ha by Francisco Moreno in Patagonia.
- The National Park ´s system finally begins in 1922. Argentina has been seriously working in the protection of it ´s natural heritage since then.
- > Argentina is the 3rd country in America to have protected areas.
- The APN has a ranger school since 1964 and has also trained numerous Latin-American rangers.
- It has female rangers since 1985.
- It has formed indigenous leaders as rangers as well.
- It has agreed to support the WRC with the Tourism Secretary.
- It can destine several rangers (half or fulltime) to organize the event in 2027.
